## **COVID-19 KNOWN AS NOVEL CORONAVIRUS:**

Mason County has thirty-three (33) total confirmed cases of COVID-19, six (6) cases are active, with one (1) COVID-19 related death from Mason County at the time of this release.

#### **MEMORIAL DAY WEEKEND:**

Memorial Day is a time to remember those men and women who have made the ultimate sacrifice for our country. It's also a time we can celebrate and thank those who have served and continue to serve our country. Help us honor those by **celebrating safely** and remember to **recreate responsibly**.

#### **BUSINESSES IN MASON COUNTY CLOSING FOREVER:**

The stay home orders along with the closure requirements has been extremely hard on our local business owners throughout Mason County. Due to the ongoing closures in Mason County, four (4) businesses have already been forced to close their doors forever. As we continue with the stay home order and closure requirements, we now have six (6) more businesses that may be forced to close their doors forever as well.

## **WASHINGTON COUNTIES SAFE START STATUS:**

- Mason County is still <u>in phase one</u> of the Safe Start reopening process. We are working through the documentation and application process. Our County plans to apply to move to phase II. The process is:
  - o Recommendation from the Mason County Health Officer;
  - Support from the Local Board of Health;
  - A letter from Mason General Hospital certifying they have adequate bed capacity for our community and adequate personal protective supplies to keep workers safe.
  - The Mason County Board of County Commissioners must approve the request to move to phase II.
- There are ten (10) more counties that are now eligible to apply to move to phase two:
  Adams, Clallam, Clark, Kitsap, Island, Lewis, Mason, Thurston, San Juan and Spokane.
- There are ten (10) counties <u>in phase two</u> of the Safe Start reopening process: Asotin, Columbia, Garfield, Lincoln, Ferry, Pend Oreille, Skamania, Stevens, Wahkiakum and Whitman.

- There is one (1) county that has <u>applied to move to phase two</u> of the Safe Start reopening process and is still under review: **Kittitas**
- There are two (2) <u>eligible counties that have not applied to move to phase two</u> of the Safe Start reopening process: **Grays Harbor and Jefferson**

## **UNEMPLOYMENT:**

**Currently, the unemployment rate in Mason County is 25%.** Due to unemployment fraud, payments are being delayed by one to two (1-2) days to give staff time to verify the recipients are current, qualified recipients rather than a fraudulent claim.

Fraud can also be reported by phone to the Office of Special Investigations.
