COVID-19 KNOWN AS NOVEL CORONAVIRUS:

Mason County has thirty-four (34) total confirmed cases of COVID-19, six (6) cases are active, with one (1) COVID-19 related death from Mason County at the time of this release.

MASON COUNTY IN PHASE II:

On Saturday, May 23, 2020, Mason County was approved to move to phase II of Governor Inslee's Safe Start plan. Business sectors listed in Phase II may reopen only <u>AFTER</u> the state publishes its guidelines for the specific sector **and** an individual business <u>can implement</u> those guidelines. WASHINGTON COUNTIES SAFE START STATUS:

- Mason County is currently in phase two of the Safe Start reopening process.
- 21 Counties approved to move to Phase II: Adams, Asotin, Columbia, Cowlitz, Ferry, Garfield, Grant, Grays Harbor, Island, Jefferson, Lewis, Lincoln, Mason, Pacific, Pend Orielle, San Juan, Skamania, Spokane, Stevens, Wahkiakum, and Whitman
- 3 Counties eligible to submit a variance application: Clallam, Kitsap and Thurston.
- Applications from Kittitas and Clark counties are on hold until further discussion due to outbreak investigation.
