NMRFA – Workshop Meeting Minutes 460 NE Old Belfair Hwy November 8, 2014

The meeting was called to order at 9:00 am.

The purpose of the workshop is to discuss decision making process and possible options for the Tahuya Store. The primary focus is not necessarily on the outcome, but the process in reaching an agreed decision.

It is important that the process is open, transparent and inclusive of all stakeholders. Stakeholder were identified as follows:

- Fire Authority members
- Community club
- Citizens and taxpayers
- State Auditor's Office
- Mason Co Planning Dept.
- Business interests
- Shorebrook Water Committee
- Local Tahuya communities

It's important to have all input; not just the vocal minority. It was pointed out that taxpayers who live outside the area be included in communications.

Fact finding and gathering relevant information will be the first step in the process. In order to minimize subjectivity, it's important to gather neutral information and possible ideas/concepts; reduce likelihood of attaching ideas to "self" or personalities.

It's important to note this is a "public input" process, but not a "public decision" action. It was suggested there be vary methods of fact finding to encourage greater input from the public and stakeholders. It was deemed appropriate to frame and reframe the process to facilitate future and progress decision making; eliminate rehashing old issues or placing blame; and not make this a battleground for old arguments.

It's important to recognize there are emotions tied to the history of Tahuya and the store, but separate the emotions from the decisions.

The fact-finding will be based upon legality to the RFA, costs, engineering options and limitations, and the viability of project ideas.

There was general discussion on the timeline for address the issue of the store. Does it belong in the strategic plan? When should a decision be made? What about input from summer residents? There is the concern that the longer a decision is delayed the greater the deterioration of the building. The

building has been unoccupied for 10 years and there are structural problems with the plumbing, electrical and roof.

Several options have been presented for use; regardless the store and its use should be "beneficial to the purpose and mission of the fire authority".

There have been recent modifications for safety reasons. Recent estimates for basic remodel just to occupy and heat (with no specific purpose) range from \$150,000 to \$200,000. Everything after that for more specified use would increase in costs to the RFA.

The RFA board will take ideas for the store; but each will need to be vetted based upon listed criteria of legality, costs, engineering viability, etc.

After the New Year, the board will discuss a timeline to take public input. Many of the "snow bird" residents start to return around May and June. A date will be set this spring.

Assistant Chief Cooper informed the board that this weekend was the final weekend for surplus sales. After all sales were completed, it would then proceed to the salvage stage and then finally the disposal of whatever is left.

The meeting was adjourned at 10:18 am.

2015 BUDGET HEARING

The meeting was called to order at 5:09pm and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance.

Chief Bakken presented the 2015 budget for the Fire Authority for 2015. 2015 Budget Attached.

No members of the public were present for comment. We will adopt the Budget at next week's meeting.

Regular Commissioner Meeting Commenced

The minutes from the meetings held on 10/14/2014 and 10/21/2014 were presented for approval.

Commissioner Quigley moved to approve the meeting minutes from the meetings as presented; Commissioner Voss-Petredis seconded the motion. Motion carried.

Voucher Review and Approval: Vouchers for the month of November were presented for review and approval.

Commissioner Voss Petredis moved to approve Vouchers #1411001 to #1411120 in the amount of \$317,671.73 as presented; Commissioner Quigley seconded the motion. Motion carried.

FINANCIAL REPORT:

Chief Bakken will do a thorough review of financials at next week's meeting but wanted to briefly update the Commissioners that we brought in \$800k in tax collections. This is great news. He also reported we are at 95% of our revenues.

ADMINISTRATION REPORT:

Dissolution Update: The dissolution of the Districts passed with 80% approval in Tahuya and 76% approval in Belfair. With that, both fire districts will dissolve at the end of the year. At the end of the year Executive Assistant Patti will request that all monies from District's 2 and 8 be transferred to the Fire Authority. This would zero out those districts expense funds.

Chief Bakken recommended that we add language to the RFA Service Plan that directs money from District's 2 and 8 to the Fire Authority following the dissolution. We have already done this with Kitsap County.

Strategic Planning Update: The Community Open House was held Monday evening at Theler. There was good participation and input from the 20 plus community members in attendance. The overall message was "keep doing what you are doing" and requests to continue to keep open lines of communication.

Hood Canal Coordinating Council Award: C shift members received this award for their participation in a wildfire in August. Chief Bakken and Volunteer Michael Wesson accepted the award.

Surplus Update: Chief Cooper reported we are in the fourth and final phase of the store surplus. Only ay a few items remain. Items sold have been documented and monies collected and deposited. Chief Bakken believes the process has been well received. Chief also reiterated that we do not have plans yet for the store and stated we have work to do. Surplus sales have brought in \$1,240.00 to date.

Disaster Preparedness Class: Class is scheduled for Saturday, November 15th from 8am until 12pm. This is one of four classes for the year.

EMT Class: There are 19 students in the class. No date set for a graduation. There are 9 from the Fire Authority and 11 from the SAFER program.

Bates Graduation: Matt Doran has completed the Bates Academy. A graduation ceremony will be held tomorrow evening at 7:00pm in Tacoma. Chief Bakken and Captain Reese will be in attendance. Congratulations to Matt!

Assistance to Firefighters Grant (AFG): This grant is up for application and closes mid-December. We plan to request \$30-50k dollars.

Collective Bargaining Agreement: Chief spoke with the Union and it sounds like we are close to completion of the 2015-2017 Bargaining Agreement. Chief will meet with the Union on Thursday or Friday. We hope to have a final presentation for the Commissioners at next week's meeting.

Brush Truck: A discussion is planned for next week's meeting to review a proposal to surplus the Brush Truck. We have paid \$21k in repairs on a truck that has approximately 18k miles.

Commissioner Voss-Petredis inquired about the Brush Truck that was in Tahuya.

Disaster Planning Class: On Saturday, the Fire Authority along with Mason County DEM, Red Cross and Cascade Natural Gas conducted the first of several scheduled classes on disaster preparedness. Chief Bakken asked the Commissioners for direction for Authority Secretary Patti to sign the Budget Certification.

Commissioner McIntosh directed Authority Secretary Patti to sign the certification and submit on behalf of the Fire Authority.

NMRFA STUDENT FIREFIGHTER PROGRAM GOAL

The Goal of the Student Firefighter Program is to help and assist aspiring individuals to prepare for and obtain a fire service career.

PURPOSE

The Authority wishes to provide financial reimbursement for members in the student firefighter program, who encounter costs for taking a firefighter entrance test with an outside organization or testing agency.

POLICY

The Fire Authority is authorized to reimburse student firefighters for the costs of taking entry level firefighter tests. The Authority will pay a maximum of \$75 per firefighter, per test (to include CPAT) for fire tests taken in the states of Washington, Idaho and Oregon. Student firefighters will be reimbursed for testing costs after providing the Authority with a receipt and a job announcement. Student firefighters must meet all minimum requirements of the job posting in order to receive reimbursement for test costs.

For testing through the Public Safety Testing Network or Bates Technical College, a maximum one time reimbursement of \$75 will be provided. Additional reimbursement for testing through the network or College may be approved by the Fire Chief.

Student firefighters may use an Authority vehicle to travel to and from test site locations however the Authority will not cover coverage mileage expenses, lodging or meals associated with job testing events.

SCOPE

All Student Firefighters

PROGRAM GOAL

The Goal of the Student Firefighter Program is to help and assist aspiring individuals to prepare for and obtain a fire service career.

PURPOSE

The Authority maintains a Student Firefighter Program that works to mutually benefit the Authority and those members who serve in the program. The program is designed to provide student firefighters with premier instruction/training and on the job training that prepares them for a career within the fire service. Success of the program is directly measured and evaluated by the number of student firefighters who obtain a career position within the fire service.

The Student Firefighter Program will have a maximum of 6 (six) positions (2 per response shift) at any given time. This maximum is established so that each program member will receive the time and attention necessary for obtaining program goals. The maximum number of positions may be exceeded at the discretion of the Fire Chief. Each position within the program is designed to last for a training period of three years, (or less should program members obtain a career position with a fire service agency).

The Authority will receive benefit from the Student Firefighter Program by having additional "in training" personnel, who have a high level of accountability and dedication for rendering emergency services for the North Mason Community. Obtaining a position within the program is very competitive and selection procedures will identify those who show the attributes necessary for serving as a future career firefighter.

POLICY

Department Training

Education and training for the student firefighter are the two most important elements of the program. The Authority will provide the student firefighter with training and educational opportunities to enhance his / her skills which best positions them for obtaining a career in the

fire service. The training program will consist of classes, drills, academies and "on the job" experience opportunities that will mimic training programs established for career firefighters within the region. All training will be provided at Authority cost. The authority retains the right to recover training costs in the event of course failure.

Student firefighters shall be required to attend the Bates Technical College Fire Training Academy within one year of entering the program.

Training Assignment

Student Firefighters will be assigned to one of three shifts, depending on specific training and supervisory needs of the Authority.

For the purpose of achieving the goal's program and to maximize training administration it is recommendation that student firefighters provide a minimum of eight 24 hour duty assignments per month with their assigned shift. It is also recommended that student firefighters be available for outside training opportunities and outside emergency response assignments (wildland fires, disaster response). In the event that student firefighters routinely fail to meet these recommendations, their status within the program will be reviewed by the assigned duty Captain and Assistant Chief. Student firefighter attendance is not mandatory or required at any time while in the program.

Student firefighter duty hours will normally commence at 0800 hours and conclude at 0800 hours the following day. Resident Firefighters are not required to maintain these hours. They are expected to be available to receive sufficient training in a timely manner.

Uniform

Student firefighters will be provided with two sets of Authority uniforms, to include: nomex shirt and pant, T-shift, belt (1), duty boots (1), sweatshirt (1), coat (1) and badge (1). Student firefighters are required to wear uniform, in accordance with Authority policy when participating in duty assignment or other Authority organized activity/training.

Training Assignment

Student Firefighters will be assigned to one of three shifts, depending on specific training and supervisory needs of the Authority.

For the purpose of achieving the goal's program and to maximize training administration it is recommendation that student firefighters provide a minimum of eight 24 hour duty assignments per month with their assigned shift. It is also recommended that student firefighters be available for outside training opportunities and outside emergency response assignments (wildland fires, disaster response). In the event that student firefighters routinely fail to meet these recommendations, their status within the program will be reviewed by the assigned duty Captain and Assistant Chief. Student firefighter attendance for duty assignments is not mandatory or required at any time while in the program.

Student firefighter duty hours will normally commence at 0800 hours and conclude at 0800 hours the following day. Resident Firefighters are not required to maintain these hours. They are expected to be available to receive sufficient training in a timely manner.

Supervision

The student firefighter shall be assigned to a shift Captain who serves as the immediate supervisor. It is expected that senior student firefighters, volunteers, career firefighters and senior officers will also provide supervision and instructed as needed. Adherence to this instruction and supervision is advised in absence of conflict directives from the immediate supervisor. All administrative and supervisory functions shall follow standard chain of command procedures. Student firefighters are to adhere to all policies of the Authority.

Cost Reimbursement

The Authority seeks to reimburse student firefighters for costs incurred during their inclusion into the student firefighter program. Costs include but are not limited to travel, meals, minor equipment, accommodations, etc. Student firefighters will be provided with a monthly stipend to assist with cost reimbursement. For the purpose of cost reimbursement student residents will receive a \$200 stipend per month. For students who receive their Firefighter I IFSAC certification from the Fire Academy, the stipend will be increased to \$500 per month. Student firefighters will first receive their cost reimbursement stipend during their second month in the program. All stipend amounts are susceptible to all applicable taxes and deductions.
